Recommendation of the Eastern Caribbean Telecommunications Authority ("ECTEL")

To the National Telecommunications Regulatory Commission to consult on The Confidential Aspects of Approved Interconnection Agreements and Cable and Wireless Reference Interconnection Offer (RIO)

Comment on Comments

1. The National Telecommunications Regulatory Commission received a submission from ECTEL containing ECTEL's recommendations on the Confidential Aspects of approved Interconnection Agreements and Cable and Wireless RIO.

7. Following the Comment on Comments period, the Directorate will consider all comments received and then present revised paper on the Confidential Aspects of approved Interconnection Agreements to the Council of Ministers.
